Pralhad Joshi visits Greenko's Integrated Renewable Energy Project in Pinnapuram

(Capital Information) Pinnapuram (Andhra Pradesh), Apr 18: Union Minister of New and Renewable Energy Pralhad Joshi visited Greenko's largest GW-scale Integrated Renewable Energy Project here on Friday.

The project is being developed with a total investment of USD 4.2 billion — comprising USD 1.2 billion for the pumped storage component and USD 3 billion for the solar and wind generation infrastructure.

This pioneering, world-first Renewable Energy Project includes 4,000 MW of solar, 1,000 MW of wind, and 1,680 MW of pumped hydropower genera-

With a storage capacity of 10,080 MWh per day in a single cycle, the dispatchable, carbonfree energy generated from the project will support industries such as green steel, green aluminum, and green hydrogen production.

Bhu Bharati Act will resolve land issues ignored by previous BRS regime: Minister Ponguleti protect the common man."

Hyderabad, Apr 18: Telangana Revenue Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy on Friday launched the Bhu Bharati pilot project at Venkatapur in Mulugu district, marking a major step toward resolving long-standing land issues in the state.

The initiative was inaugurated in the presence of Ministers Konda Surekha and Anasuya Seethakka.

Later, Ponguleti addressed an awareness programme in Pusai village in Adilabad district , where he spoke in detail about the Bhu Bharati Act.

The Minister stated that out of 18 lakh acres of land pushed into Part-B by the previous BRS government in what he termed a conspiratorial move, nearly 6 to 7 lakh acres are agricultural lands, which will now be regularised under the Bhu Bharati Act. "We brought this Act to wipe the tears of the poor and to build a state free from land disputes. fulfilling the vision of Indiramma



Rajya," he said. Highlighting the government's farmer-friendly approach, the Minister said, "Gone are the days when farmers had to run around revenue offices. Now, officials will come to them to resolve their land-related

He criticised the previous BRS administration, accusing it of failing to hold revenue conferences on the Dharani portal and ignoring the plight of landowners. "If such conferences had been held, people would have revolted then itself," he said.

Taking a direct jab at former Chief Minister K Chandrashekar Rao (KCR), Ponguleti said, "If KCR brought the Dharani Act in 2020 for the Pink Party, we have brought the 2025 Bhu Bharati Act for the people. That Act could have been thrown into the Bay of Bengal, but this Act will

The Minister also announced that the government is taking steps to regularise Abadi houses, which have long remained undocumented. He vowed to resist any attempt to destabilise the Indiramma government through money power or vested interests. "Will you stay silent if this people's government is toppled by Dharani dalals and Gulabi Party slaves?" he asked, receiving a resounding "No" from the crowd.

To enhance transparency and accessibility, Ponguleti said a toll-free helpline connecting the Revenue Department and the Chief Commissioner of Land Administration (CCLA) office would soon be launched to address Bhu Bharati-related aueries.

He also announced that a committee will be formed under Central Government guidelines to find a lasting solution to land disputes in tribal and non-tribal

Bandi Sanjay slams Cong over Waqf lands

Hyderabad, Apr 18: Union Minister of State for Home Affairs Bandi Sanjay Kumar made sharp remarks on Friday, accusing the Congress and AIMIM of "conspiring" to "incite unrest" in Hyderabad under the guise of protests against the Waqf Board Amendment

He alleged that the Revanth Reddy-led Telangana government is extending financial support to the AIMIM's public meeting against

Speaking to the media at the BJP state office, Sanjay warned of a "Bengal-like situation" if such activities continue, stating that the government will be held responsible for any consequences.

He demanded transparency over Waqf land dealings, claiming that while the state holds 77,000 acres of Waqf property, most are misused or illegally occupied, benefiting leaders instead of poor

Turning to the National Herald case, Sanjay called the Congress protest a "fake drama" and denied any BJP involvement, reminding that the case was filed in 2012 and is under judicial

He accused the Gandhi family of converting party funds into personal wealth through the Young India Trust, highlighting an ED chargesheet alleging Rs 998 crore in money

Sanjay questioned the lack of audits on Waqf properties nationwide, alleging encroachments even on temple and gurudwara lands in several states. He demanded a white paper on Waqf land income, utilisation, and encroachments in Telangana, challenging the state government and Waqf Board to ensure

BJP waging righteous battle against opportunistic alliance of Cong, BRS, Majlis: Kishan Reddy

(Capital Information) Hyderabad, Apr 18: Union Minister and Telangana BJP President G Kishan Reddy strongly criticised the Congress, BRS, and Mailis parties. accusing them of forming an opportunistic alliance aimed at undermining democratic values in Telangana

He was addressing party leaders and workers during a preparatory meeting for the upcoming Hyderabad Local Bodies MLC elections at Haritha Plaza, Begumpet on Friday.

Reddy alleged that both the Congress and BRS parties were compromising Telangana's future by aligning themselves with the Majlis party, which he said had a history of exploiting people, committing atrocities, and spreading communalism. "These parties say 'ji huzoor' to the Majlis, which carries the legacy of the Razakars. They are conspiring together to ensure the Majlis party's victory in Hyderabad," he remarked.

He questioned the silence of Congress and BRS over their decision not to field can-



didates in the local body elections. "Why are they not contesting? Their silence is proof of their secret alliance with the Majlis party," he said, adding that their leaders, Rahul Gandhi and former Chief Minister and BRS chief K Chandrasekhar Rao (KCR), lacked the moral right to criticise the BJP while bowing to the Majlis.

Highlighting the BJP's stance, Reddy said the party was not fighting just for political gain but out of a sense of nationalism. "The BJP's goal is to awaken the people of Hyderabad and save the city from communal fanaticism and political hooliganism. Winning is not our only objective-reviving democratic spirit and civic development is," he asserted. He accused the Congress

government of painting a false image of development. "They promoted the high-tech city, but the reality is that only real estate-driven projects were prioritised. Civic bodies like GHMC are in shambles today, unable to even fund street lights," he said.

Reddy emphasised that only a "double engine government"with the BJP in power both at the Centre and in the state-could bring real development to Telangana. He also underscored the Modi government's achievements in economic and tax reforms, curbing terrorism, and boosting foreign policy.

Urging voters to choose wisely, Reddy said, "Telangana cannot afford another era like the Razakar rule. If people do not vote consciously, the state will fall prey to the same forces once again.

He called upon every BJP worker to strive for the victory of the party's candidate, Gautam Rao, in the Hyderabad Local Bodies MLC elections, promising a vision of inclusive development and civic revival.

Rain with gusty winds lash Hyderabad, disrupting daily life

Hyderabad, Apr 18: Sudden and intense rainfall accompanied by gusty winds, thunder, and lightning swept through various parts of Hyderabad on Friday, causing major disruptions across the city.

Areas including SR Nagar, Borabanda, Ameerpet, Panjagutta, Madhuranagar, Jubilee Hills, Banjara Hills, Kothi, Sultan Bazar, Begambazar Abids, Nampally, Basheerbagh, and Himayathnagar witnessed downpour. Similar



conditions were reported in Mehdipatnam, Masab Tank, Karwan, Boy napalli, Tirumalgiri, Alwal, Maredpally, and Qutubullapur

The rainfall extended to suburbs like Gundlapochampally, Dundigal, Dhulapally, Bahadurpally, Miyapur, and Nanakramguda. Secunderabad Railway Station, Chaitanyapuri, Dilsukhnagar, Gachibowli, Vanasthalipuram, and other localities also experienced heavy rain.

A huge tree was uprooted near Gandhi Bhavan due to the strong winds, further aggravating traffic issues. In areas such as Champapet, Saidabad, and Saroornagar, the rain was particularly intense, accompanied by powerful gusts.

Widespread power outages have been reported across several areas, adding to the public inconvenience. Motorists were seen struggling as traffic came to a near standstill on multiple roads due to waterlogging and reduced visibility.

The Meteorological Centre has issued a warning, predicting more rain in several parts of Hyderabad within the next hour.

VHP to hold statewide protests in Telangana

(Capital Information) Hyderabad, Apr 18: The Vishwa Hindu Parishad (VHP) on Friday announced that it will hold statewide protests in Telangana on Saturday to condemn the violence against Hindus in West Bengal.

In a statement, VHP National Spokesperson Ravinu-Shashidhar Telangana State President Bhojan Palli Narasimha Murthy alleged that brutal attacks were being carried out against Hindus in the name of the Waqf Act, fueled by vote-bank politics.

They demanded the immediate imposition of President's rule in West Bengal and strict action against extremists allegedly targeting Hindus, especially in border areas near Bangladesh.

Protests will be organised at all district headquarters, and petitions will be submitted to the respective district collectors, with a request to forward them to the President

The VHP appealed to the Hindu community to participate in large numbers.

Trough now extends from North Madhya Maharashtra to Gulf of Mannar : Met

Amaravati, Apr 18 (UNI) The trough that was present from Marathwada to the Gulf of Mannar on Thursday now extends from North Madhva Maharashtra to the Gulf of Mannar, passing through Marathwada, Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema, and Tamil Nadu at an altitude of 0.9 km above mean sea level, according to the Meteorological Center.

In its daily weather report issued on Friday, the Centre stated that thunderstorms accompanied by lightning and gusty winds with speeds ranging from 40?50 kmph are likely to occur at isolated places in Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Yanam, and Rayalaseema over the next five days.

Light to moderate rain or thundershowers are also likely at one or two places in Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Yanam, and Rayalaseema during the next seven days.

Maximum temperatures are expected to gradually rise by 2?3 degrees Celsius over the next four days, with no significant change anticipated between April 21 and 23.

Rainfall was recorded at one or two places in Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, and Rayalaseema during the last 24 hours.

The highest temperature of 40.5 degrees Celsius was reported at Anantapur in Rayalaseema on Thursday, the report added.

TPCC chief Mahesh Kumar Goud slams Kishan Reddy, accuses BJP of caste and communal politics

(Capital Information) Hyderabad, Apr 18: Telangana Pradesh Congress Committee (TPCC) President Mahesh Kumar Goud launched a scathing attack on Union Minister and BJP leader G Kishan Reddy, questioning his contributions to Telangana during his long political career.

Addressing the media at Gandhi Bhavan on Friday, Goud accused the BJP and BRS of playing political dramas and secret alliances during elections.

"What has Kishan Reddy done for Telangana or even Amberpet in his 25-year political career?" Goud asked, challenging the Union Minister to list his achievements.

He ridiculed Kishan Reddy's silence on critical state issues and asked, "Does he even have the courage to speak about what he has delivered for



Telangana?

Calling the BJP's dream of forming a government in Telangana a "daydream," Goud accused the party of prioritising religion over development. He claimed that Kishan Reddy wakes up every day with Akbaruddin Owaisi on his mind, adding mockingly that "they must have been brothers in a previous life."

Goud said BJP leaders remain silent on major is-

sues like Metro Rail expansion, the Kaleshwaram corruption allegations, and industrial development in HCU lands that could generate jobs. He asked why the Union Minister failed to raise these concerns with the Prime Minister.

NPRD demands strict action against rapist of deaf girl in UP

Hyderabad, Apr 18 (UNI) The National Platform for the Rights of the Disabled (NPRD) and its Women's Department State Committees have strongly condemned the brutal rape of a deaf girl in Rampur, Uttar Pradesh, demanding stringent action against the accused, Dan Singh.

In a statement signed by T Varamma, State Honorary President, K Venkat, State President, M Adivaya, State General Secretary and C Sayamma, State Convener, NPRD Women's Wing here on Friday, said the heinous act of dragging a deaf girl into a field and sexually assaulting her highlights the urgent need for stronger legal protections for women with disabilities. The organization demanded that the accused be charged under the POCSO Act and Sections 92(b), 92(d), and 92(e) of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPD) Act, 2016.

"The serious injuries on the girl's face are a clear indication of the inhuman brutality inflicted upon her," the NPRD stated, adding that rape cases against women with disabilities are rising, particularly in BJP-ruled states. The forum criticised the Yogi Adityanath government for its failure to protect the disabled and accused it of negligence in taking swift action.

The NPRD also expressed concern over reports that the accused opened fire on the police during the attempted arrest, calling it further evidence of a law-and-order breakdown.

Sukrutha Multispeciality Hospital: A Miraculous Medical Success in a Critical Ectopic Pregnancy Case

(Capital Information) Javashankar bhupalpally, Apr 18: Doctors at Sukrutha Multispeciality Hospital performed a life-saving miracle by rescuing a woman in a critical condition. The 35-year-old patient was admitted to the hospital in a lifethreatening state due to a ruptured ectopic pregnancy (a pregnancy occurring outside the uterus), leading to severe internal bleeding. Her hemoglobin level was only 4g/dL, and her blood pressure was untraceable. Doctors stated that in such critical cases, only about 5% of patients survive.

A rapid-response medical team led by Critical Care Specialist Dr. Ramprasad Reddy and Gynecologist Dr. Padma Pravallika immediately sprang into action. They arranged for 5 units of blood and rushed the patient into emergency surgery. Under the leadership of Dr. Padma Pravallika, Dr. Ramprasad Reddy, and Anesthesiologist Dr. Srikant, a threehour-long surgery was performed to control the bleeding.



India trashes Bangladesh's 'unwarranted comments' on Murshidabad violence

New Delhi, Apr 18 (UNI) India's fraught ties with Bangladesh appeared to have slipped another notch down, as New Delhi today rejected Dhaka's remarks over

the Murshidabad violence, terming it as a "barely disguised and disingenuous attempt to draw a parallel with India's concerns over the ongoing persecution of minorities Bangladesh".

In a strong statement, the Ministry of External Affairs spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal, said:

"We reject the remarks made by the Bangladesh side with regard to the incidents in West Bengal.

"This is a barely disguised

and disingenuous attempt to draw a parallel with India's concerns over the ongoing persecution of minorities in Bangladesh where the criminal perpetrators of such acts

continue to roam free.

"Instead of making unwarranted comments and indulging in virtue signaling, Bangladesh would do better to focus on protecting the rights of its own minorities."

The statement comes as Bangladesh Chief Advisor's Press Secretary Shafiqul Alam "strongly protested"

India's attempt to link Bangladesh with the anti-Wagf Amendment Act violence in Murshidabad.

He also asked India to take steps to "protect the minority Muslim population".

Murshidabad in West Bengal has witnessed widespread violence and arson over the Waqf Amendment Act, with three people killed so far, and

many homes and buildings destroyed. Hundreds of people have fled to the neighbouring areas for safety.


Put again under house arrest ahead of Friday prayers: Mirwaiz

"My house detention case is still pending in court, where I am seeking relief from the Hon'ble High Court ,but in such times, patience remains our only strength," he said.

Mirwaiz, who also heads the Muttahida Majlis-e-Ulama (MMU), the largest amalgam of religious organisations in J&K, issued a resolution against the Waqf Act, which Imams read during the congregational prayers.



As per data from September 2024, across 25 States/UTs Waqf Boards, a total of 5,973 government properties have been declared as Waqf properties.

Referring to Sachar Committee report, Antony said Waqf properties cover approximately 37 lakh acres, with a potential annual income of Rs 12,000 crore. The new law mandates registration of all Waqf properties and ensures that the generated income is used for the welfare of the poor, and no religious places would be affected by the act, he asserted.

Two Himachal cops sacked for drug links

The Himachal Pradesh government has sacked two police constables, Sandeep Kumar and Jugal Kishore, for their involvement in drug trafficking, police said.

This is perhaps the first time in the state's history that such strict action has been taken against police personnel accused of drug smuggling, according to Shimla Superintendent Police Sanjeev Gandhi.

The termination orders were issued following directions from the Chief Minister's Office. Both constables, who were posted in the Shimla Police, were initially transferred to the Kainthu police station after their alleged involvement came to light.

Formal notices were subsequently served,

Investigations revealed that the two constables had links with the Shah Syndicate, a notorious drug trafficking gang operating in the re-

Israel extends missile alert time for long-range missiles from Yemen

Jerusalem, Apr 18 (UNI) Israel has extended its missile warning time for long-range threats from Yemen by three to five minutes, the military's Home Front Command said on Thursday.

The updated system, which took effect Thursday, aims to allow civilians more time to reach shelters and safe rooms amid renewed missile attacks by Houthi forces, following Israel's resumption of its air and ground assault on Gaza in March.

Until now, Israelis had about one minute to reach shelter upon receiving a siren warning for long-range missiles. For short-range rockets fired from Gaza, warning times vary by location, ranging from about 15 seconds in communities



near the enclave to roughly one minute in the Tel Aviv

Under the new protocol, a preliminary alert will be issued via the Home Front Command's mobile app in

areas at risk, using a notification sound instead of the standard rising and falling

"In addition, an IDF (Israel Defence Forces) message will be distributed, stating that missile fire from Yemen toward Israel may occur in the coming minutes and that the public must follow the instructions of the Home Front Command," the military said in a statement.

The purpose of the advance warning is to "allow advance preparedness, enabling civilians to move to nearby shelters and receive updates from sources," the statement added.

Since October 2023, Houthi forces in Yemen have launched dozens of missile and drone attacks toward Israel, citing solidarity with the Palestinians amid Israel's offensive in Gaza. Iran has also carried out two retaliatory attacks, firing about 400 missiles and drones, according to Israeli figures.

2 Palestinians killed by Israeli forces in West Bank: Health Ministry

Ramallah, Apr 18 (UNI) Two Palestinians were shot and killed by Israeli forces near the town of Osarin in the Nablus Governorate in northern West Bank on Thursday night, the Palestinian Health Ministry said.

The Ramallah-based ministry in a brief statement identified the killed victims as Jihad Adham Abdullah Adili, 17, and Saif Ghassan Jabr Adili, 19.

The Israeli forces stormed Osarin amid heavy firing of live bullets, and confrontations broke out in the area, the Palestinian official news agency WAFA reported.

Another 20-year-old Palestinian was injured with a bullet in the knee, WAFA said.

The Israel Defence Forces (IDF) said in a statement on Thursday night that during IDF "activity" in the area of Osarin, its soldiers identified three "terrorists" who hurled rocks toward vehicles on the highway and endangered the lives of the passengers.

"The soldiers fired toward the terrorists to remove the threat, eliminating two terrorists and injuring one," it added.

UN sees U.S.-Iran nuclear talks as "good sign": Spokesman United Nations, Apr 18

(UNI)The United Nations views the second round of negotiations between the weekend as "a good sign," and hopes it will yield posiresults, a UN spokesman said on Thursday.

The second round of U.S.-Iran indirect negotiations will be held in Rome on Saturday, according to the Iranian Foreign Ministry. The two sides will discuss Tehran's nuclear issues and Washington's sanctions.

"We very much hope that the dialogue between the United States and the Islamic Republic of Iran yields a positive outcome. which we're seeing the lowering of tensions in the Gulf region, in the Middle East, and between the two countries," Stephane Dujarric,



spokesman for the UN secretary-general, said at a daily briefing.

"We understand that there will be a second round from what I've seen, I think this weekend, which in itself is a good sign," he said. "We will obviously be following it very closely."

In early March, U.S. President Donald Trump sent a letter to Iranian leaders, proposing negotiations on Iran's nuclear program, while Iran later agreed on indirect talks.

The first round of U.S.-Iran indirect talks was held in the Omani capital of Muscat last week. The White House said in a statement that discussions were "very positive and constructive." Iranian Foreign Ministry described their talks as "constructive."


Peruvian govt extends state of emergency due to heavy rains

Lima, Apr 18 (UNI) The Peruvian government announced on Thursday the extension for 30 days of the state of emergency in 157 districts from 20 departments due to intense rains.

According to a decree published in the official newspaper "El Peruano", the government said the measure will apply from

the Amazonas, Ancash, Cusco, Huancavelica, Huanuco, La Libertad, Lima, Loreto, Madre de Piura, and Dios, other regions.

The emergencies reported so far, including landslides, floods and collapses, have affected 187,486 people. A total of 91 people have died and 14 others have disappeared due to

Russian President Putin meets Iranian FM Abbas Araghchi in Kremlin, discusses US-Iran deal

Moscow/Tehran, Apr 18 (UNI) Russian President Vladimir Putin met with Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi in the Kremlin, and discussed various issues such as further cooperation and Moscow's help in mediating Tehran's nuclear deal with Washington.

Calling the talks between Putin and Araghchi on Thursday as intense, Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov said "Yesterday, Russian President Vladimir Putin had a long and rich conversation, and he was very pleased with the conversation", according to Sputnik.

The Russian FM added that the talks between Putin and Araghchi highlighted the unprecedented dynamics of the political dialogue between Moscow and Tehran.

Regarding the US-Iran nuclear deal, Moscow on April 16 said that it is prepared to do "everything" within its power to help diplomatically resolve the standoff between the United States and Iran over Tehran's nuclear programme, as per the

Moscow Times During his meeting with Putin, the Iranian FM also conveyed a written message from Iran's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, who has gone underground with heightened security since Israel killed Hezbollah chief Hassan Nasrallah

in Beirut last year. The message was related to the Iran-US talks as well as Washington's dialogue with Moscow on the ongoing Russia-Ukraine war. Araghchi expressed hope for continued cooperation between Moscow and Tehran across various areas.

Over 5k Afghan refugees expelled from Pak in one single day

Kabul, Apr 18 (UNI) Pakistan expelled over 5,000 Afghan refugees on Thursday, the local media Tolonews reported on Friday.

The refugees returned from Pakistan via Torkham and Spin Boldak crossing points to Afghanistan on Thursday, the report said, adding that the returnees have received necessary assistance.

Reportedly, nearly 600,000 Afghan refugees, most of whom are undocumented migrants, have been expelled from Pakistan over the past two weeks. Meanwhile, Afghan authorities are building shelters at

a cost of 800,000 U.S. dollars for recently returned

refugees in east Afghanistan's Paktia province. The Afghan interim government has been repeatedly calling upon Afghan refugees to end living abroad as refugees and return home to contribute to the rebuilding of their war-torn homeland.

U.S. judge rules Google illegally monopolises digital advertising market

Washington, Apr 18 (UNI) A U.S. federal judge ruled Thursday that Google violated antitrust law by monopolising the open-web digital advertising markets, marking another major setback for the tech giant in its antitrust litigation.

According to the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia, the company "harmed Google's publishing customers, the competitive process, and, ultimately, consumers of information on the open web."

"This is a landmark victory in the ongoing fight to stop Google from monopolising the digital public square," U.S. Attorney General Pamela Bondi said in a statement.

Assistant Attorney General Abigail Slater of the Justice Department's Antitrust Division said that Google's



deplatform American voices," noting that "at the same time, Google destroyed and hid information that exposed its illegal conduct.'

"Today's opinion confirms Google's controlling hand over online advertising and, increasingly, the internet itself," said the assistant attorney general.

Google has stated that it will appeal the ruling. Lee-Anne Mulholland, Google's

U.S. federal court has ruled that Google engaged in illegal monopolistic practices. In August 2024, the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia in Washington, D.C., ruled that Google had illegally monopolised the online search market.

Policy (NEP) 2020 promises a sweeping transformation of India's education system. Its success hinges not just on vision, but on action, investment, and a unified national commitment to reimagining education for the 21st century

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 is a landmark initiative to reshape India's educational landscape, particularly by integrating vocational training into mainstream education. This integration is vital for enhancing skill development and employability, and complements initiatives such as 'Samagra Shiksha' and the

Skill India Mission. The establishment of PM SHRI Schools embodies the vision of the National Education Policy (NEP), promoting a holistic educational experience nationwide. However, significant challenges stand in the way of realising this ambitious vision.

The Challenges in Implementation

The primary objective of NEP 2020 – to ensure that by 2025, at least 50 per cent of learners receive vocational exposure — faces multiple

such as Bihar, Chhattisgarh, and Uttar Pradesh have lagged significantly in implementation due to financial constraints, inadequate infrastructure, and a shortage of qualified teachers. A staggering 75 per cent of technical institutions currently report a lack of alignment between the skills being taught and those sought by industry, highlighting a disconnect that must be addressed.

At the core of these challenges is the lack of a well-designed curriculum that is robust enough to meet the demands of the job market.

Despite a government push, only about 5 per cent of students in vocational education receive practical training in fields relevant to today's job market. Many traditional academic institutions remain reintegrating sistant to vocational education into their curricula, fearing it may dilute academic rigour.

This results in inadequate exposure for students, many of whom graduate without the skills needed to thrive in a competitive labour market.

Furthermore, there is a notable deficiency in educators trained in emerging tech-

he National Education hurdles. As of 2023, states nologies, such as Artificial Intelligence (AI), the Internet of Things (IoT), and automation. Reports indicate that over 80 per cent of institutions lack faculty proficiency in these essential areas, compromising the quality of vocational train-

ing offered. The Path Forward

The path forward requires actionable strategies to ensure that vocational education becomes a core component of the school curriculum. Making vocational education mandatory from Class 9 to Class 12, with students continuing in their chosen fields, is essential.

For instance, a student selecting 'Electrician' as a vocational subject should continue to engage with this subject through Class 10 and beyond, ensuring a deep, practical understanding.

To encourage participation, the government could implement a financial incentive model. Providing a monthly stipend of Rs 500 for students from economically weaker sections, along with a vocational training kit, could promote enrollment. An increased stipend of Rs 1,000 per month for students who continue in vocational training



through their higher classes would further incentivise sustained commitment. Graduating students should receive certification after four years, bolstering their employability both domestically and interna-

Bridging the Skill Gap

India, with over 260 million students in 1.5 million schools and more than 40 million in higher education, holds one of the largest student popula-

tions globally. Yet, the Gross Enrollment Ratio (GER) stands at approximately 32 per cent, compelling many to seek employment in the unorganised sector — a domain fraught with exploitation and

the potential to effectively address this gap. By focusing on industry-relevant skills, these programs not only enhance employment opportunities but also foster the development of future entrepreneurs.

Countries like Germany and Switzerland exemplify successful dual vocational education systems, blending classroom learning with hands-on industry experience.

India could adopt similar frameworks, ensuring students gain practical exposure, which is increasingly necessary in an evolving job landscape.

Adapting to Emerging Technologies

As technological innovation accelerates, vocational programs must incorporate modern skills relating to Al, IoT, and cloud computing. The Central Board of Secondary Education's (CBSE) initiative to introduce AI and IoT into the curriculum for Classes VI to X is a step in the right direction. With over 20,000 teachers trained in these areas, reaching approximately 350,000 students, substantial progress is evident.

However, a 2022 survey indicated that 31 per cent of

with digital tools, while a 2023 report found that 49 per cent feel unprepared to address the impact of AI on education. To tackle these challenges effectively, the public and private sectors must invest in comprehensive teacher training that equips educators for a changing marketplace.





Punjab VB arrests 2 civil hospital staff for taking bribe

Chandigarh, April 18 (UNI) The Punjab Vigilance Bureau (VB) has uncovered a corruption scam at Civil Hospital Bholath in Kapurthala district, where employees were accepting bribes to issue false negative dope test reports. Acting on a complaint filed on the Chief

Minister's Anti-Corruption Action Line, the VB on Thursday arrested Manpreet Singh alias Sonu, a ward attendant, and Bholu alias Ismail, a contractual computer operator, for accepting Rs 10,000. The role of Dr Mohitpal, posted in the hos-

pital, and a contractual laboratory technician. Maan Singh, are under investigation, VB sources said.

An official VB spokesperson said on Friday that the investigation has revealed that the accused had demanded and accepted Rs 10,000 from the complainant to issue him a negative dope test report.

A further probe indicated that the accused were routinely accepting bribes to manipulate dope test results, which were then used for arms licence applications or during renewals. The complainant provided evidence of the bribe demand and both the positive and falsified negative reports.

A case has been registered at the VB police station, Jalandhar range. The VB is also examining the involvement of other staff members, the spokesperson said.
